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DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

2022 has been a year of tremendous community support for Growing High Point (GHP) fueling our mission of transformation. Jose Abreu joined GHP as Farm-to-Table Coordinator with years of food system experience and a fire to create change. GHP implemented two transformative programs: F.I.T., or Farmer-in-Training, and Youth Enrichment & Employment. We fulfilled our first major contract to supply food pantries with fresh produce, and harvested honey from our Apiary for the first time since it was established in 2021. Growdega — our mobile market outreach to food deserts — tripled sales in just one year.

Building community is important to our vision of vibrant communities. The newly installed Southside Community Orchard, built with volunteers, will not only be a source of fresh nutritious food, but also a place to enjoy springtime's visual bounty. GHP was thrilled to partner with the Washington Street Business Association to host the 12th annual Unity Festival and our first Local Food Fair where hundreds sampled healthy foods and learned about local resources. The Let's Grow Gala was a celebration of delicious local food and drinks and fun as well as a successful fundraiser. It has been a great year! We are deeply grateful to YOU for your support which has made our progress possible. To all our donors, board members, volunteers, and partner agencies, "Look what

GROWING ENTERPRISE AND ECONOMIC MOBILITY

F.I.T. FARMERS IN TRAINING

Two Farmers, Khalik Harper & Alexander McQueen, were sprouted this year thanks to GHP's F.I.T. program. Certificates were earned for 10 hours of intensive training weekly from March through November 2022. By joining our network of urban farmers they can sell their produce to Growdega – GHP's mobile market or sell on their own at the High Point Farmers Market! Look for them and show your support!

Andre Davis and Jason Zimmerman continue as successful urban farm leaders in our network and as an inspiration to new aspiring farmers.



GROWING THE FUTURE

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GHP YOUTH ENRICHMENT AND EMPLOYMENT

Thanks to the support of the City of High Point Community Development Block Grant, youth can be involved in all aspects of sustainable farming and food systems — from planting a farm to cooking with the food they grow to selling it at local markets. Teens are paid a stipend for up to 20 hours per week in the summer, but the benefits far outweigh the wages they earn. By the end of the season, they will gain valuable job and teamwork skills, discover new foods to eat, and learn about civic engagement. As the program grows we plan to combine field trips, nutrition education, and entrepreneurship to create a richer educational and life experience for each of the participants.





GROWDEGA

AN OASIS IN HIGH POINT'S FOOD DESERTS

Growdega carries fresh produce to communities considered food deserts. Through **twelve weekly stops**, and deliveries to the door, we are increasing consumption of fresh nutritious fruits and vegetables by making them super affordable and easily available. Growdega sales were \$39,000 in 2022 and provided over \$5,000 in EBT customer discounts!

GROWING COMMUNITY

Unity Festival - In September, GHP partnered with Washington Street Business Association and the City of High Point to celebrate our community's history and diversity at the Unity Festival and Local Food Fair at Washington Terrace Park. Over 1,200 people enjoyed a day of family fun, entertainment, and local food. Food samples were shared to demonstrate how local produce can be delicious and healthy. Food brings us together!



Fairview Elementary - We helped establish a community partnership with Fairview Elementary, and Board Member Randy Carda's Rotary club. The Rotary club has helped maintain the school garden. With the help of our Youth Employees, broccoli and kale were planted in the fall, and then harvested.
